The KANAWHA BANK is nursed by the mammoth OHIO LIFE AND TRUST Co. of Cincinnati, and why should we not quote it?

We ask those who take the REPORTER to read our articles on that class of banks—that, while we condemn, we are forced to quote them, as all take them.

We are again censured because our check was used in making up the capital of a bogus insurance company. When we give out our checks, it is supposed the holders have a right to do what they please with them.

Again, we are censured because we took the State Loan last summer; and again, because we did not take it in October. We think we know when, and when not to take State Loans, and we shall do so at our pleasure, and thank nobody for advice. The Canal Board, assisted by the Albany Evening Journal, have done their best to break down the price of New York Stock, and in their desire to favor their pet banks, have caused the state to lose half a million dollars in premiums. Had they been governed by justice and common sense, the state could have realized twenty per cent premium on all its loans—now it cannot command fifteen.

We are censured for breaking banks, and we are censured for not breaking them. We are censured for anything, everything, and nothing at all. However, we care but little for snarling curs. As a banker we are popular, and our REPORTER is reliable, and the greatest hue and cry comes from mushroom cotemporaries, who feel sore that we do not condescend to notice them in our columns by a reply. So keep cool, gentlemen, and if you don't like us, don't come near us.

SEARSPOUT BANK, Me.	PEOPLE'S BANK, Vt.
ELLSWORTH BANK, Me.	MONSON BANK, Mass.
RHODE ISLAND CENTRAL BANK.	

The "BANK OF ROYALTON" above is a chartered Bank, and should not be confounded with the "SOUTH ROYALTON BANK," which is a free and well secured Bank. The "MONSON BANK" above should not be confounded with the "MOUSUM RIVER BANK," of Maine.

It does not follow that these Banks fail: indeed, we shall be disappointed if the SUFFOLK BANK does not, in a very few days, again take a large proportion of them.

The holders of notes of the above Banks will be wise not to sacrifice by a precipitate sale, for we cannot conceive that any Bank which was sound a year ago, can be insolvent now.

Financial and Commercial.

WEDNESDAY, Nov. 21, 1855.

We notice by some published statistics in respect to the yield of gold in Australia, that up to the 25th of August last, it amounted to \$280,000,000, a large proportion of which has gone to England. During the first six months of the present year, the yield was \$27,500,000. This is an increase upon any previous six months. If this supply continues for any considerable number of years, we think, with the aid of California, we shall have enough to answer all manufacturing purposes and a metallic currency. Up to September last, the whole amount of gold, admitted to have been sent from California was \$320,000,000, and upon the most reliable information we may look for an increased yield for the next five years. In the seven years past there has been an accession of at least \$500,000,000 in gold, without apparently affecting its relative value as a currency, and still the cry is for more. We cannot see, in the future, any danger of a depreciation. The many uses to which it can be and is applied, other than as a currency, will ever keep it at its present value.

Money is again freely offered by our capitalists and various institutions upon reasonable terms and accommodating time. Call loans are negotiated at 7 per cent., while time operations pay 7, backed up by unquestionable collaterals. The Street Brokers have full employ in effecting the sale of various classes of jobbers' paper and outside securities, paying from 12 to 15 per cent. as to time and strength of makers.

The Weekly Bank Statement is looked upon as rather favorable. In all respects, except the accumulation of specie, it meets expectations. The Banks now hold over \$12,000,000 of specie, with every prospect of an increase. The comparative figures show the following, from last statement: Decrease of Loans and Discounts..... \$124,370 Decrease of Circulation..... 147,029 Decrease of Deposits..... 439,037 Increase of Specie..... 443,391

The Boston papers speak favorably of money matters there—first class paper being used at 10 1/2 per cent.

Philadelphia, too, is relieved from the temporary pressure, and the Banks are discounting liberally.

Exchange is more active, but we note no advance in rates. Sterling Bills are offered at 8 1/2 per cent.; and we hear of some, with bills of lading attached, being offered at 6 1/2 per cent. Francs are 5.27 1/2 @ 5.20.

At the Stock Board, an active and heavy business is being done. Most of the first class of interest paying stocks have advanced to nearly their price when the panic commenced, while the fancies, which found bottom, are coming up for a breathing time, and with promise of remaining on the surface until another white squall strikes them. State stocks remain firm, with slight variations, and those more the effect of call and supply, than panics—created without cause. For present prices see stock table.

Ashes—The market is firm, with good supply and fair demand. Pots sell at \$6.50, and Pearls at \$7.37 1/2 per 100 lbs; Salsolatus is firm at 6c.

Coal—We notice but small change in foreign—Liverpool Orrel is held at \$10.50; Newcastle at \$8; Pictou \$7.25; Anthracite is selling at \$4.57 @ 5.25; Breckenridge at \$15.

Coffee—The market is more active and firm. We note sales of Maracaibo at 11c; St. Domingo at 10 1/2c; Java at 14 1/2c; Rio 16 1/2c.

Candles—The demand for Adamantine is fair—we see sales at 25 @ 26c; Common Sperm 34 @ 35c; Patent 42 @ 44c; Mould Tallow 14c.

Fish—Dry Cod is plenty but firm. We notice sales of Grand and George's Bank \$3 65 @ \$4; Dry Scale at \$2.25 @ \$2.50; No. 1 Mackerel in ice \$22; No. 2 do. \$20 @ \$13.50; Pickled Cod 3.50 @ \$4; Pickled Herring \$3.50 @ \$4.50; Smoked Herr. scaled, 35 @ 37 1/2c; No. 1 do at 25 @ 27 1/2c.

Flour and Meal—The demand for State and Western brands for foreign account and the Eastern call, is good, with a speculative movement, carrying prices up beyond the views of outsiders. We quote

Grain—Wheat is in good request, with fair arrivals, and mostly in the hands of speculators, checking sales to millers. We note sales of White Canadian at \$2.25; Prime Western do at \$2.25; do Red at \$2 @ 2.25; Southern Red at \$2 @ 2.10; Rye is active at \$1.20 @ 1.25; Barley is wanted at \$1.24 @ 1.25; Corn is quiet, prices firm—we note sales of Western Mixed at 90c.

Hides—The arrivals are light of late, and prices firm, with good demand. We quote Buenos Ayres at 26c; Rio Grande 25c; Gambia at 16c; San Juan 15 1/2c; Savanilla at 18 1/2c; Porto Cabello 20 @ 22c; Matamoros 20 1/2c; Dry Southern 15 @ 18c.

Leather—The active demand has given way to moderate call, but prices remain firm. We quote as late sales—Oak Slaughter, light, at 25 @ 31c; do Middling at 25 @ 31c; Heavy 25 @ 31c; do Dry Hide 24 @ 28c; do Southern 21 @ 22c; Hamlock, Rio Grande and Buenos Ayres, light, at 21 @ 22c; Middling do 22 @ 23c; Heavy 18 @ 21c; Good Damaged 17 @ 19c.

Molasses—The market is quiet, sales moderate. We note sales of New Orleans at 30 @ 37c; Porto Rico 37c; we quote Cuba Muscovado 35 @ 37c; Clayed Cuba 33 @ 35c.

Naval Stores—The demand for Spirits of Turpentine is fair at 43 @ 44c; Crude is held at \$4 for Wilmington; Common Rosin \$1.50; Pitch \$2 @ \$2.25; Tar, this, \$2.62 1/2.

Provisions—The demand for Pork is moderate, and prices without change. 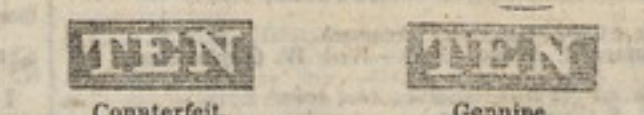

Illustrations of Late Counterfeits. The new and dangerous counterfeit 10s on the Iron Bank, Ohio, may be detected by observing that there are but two flourishes over the word TEN—in the genuine there are three.



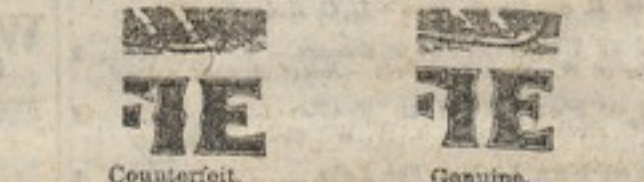
The new counterfeit 5s on the Southern Bank of Ky., may be detected by observing the difference between the shade 3 on the inside of the 'O' in SOUTHERN—in the genuine there are two separate shades—in the counterfeit they are united, forming but one shade. In the 'No' on the right, the 'o' is at too great an angle for the 'N'.



To detect the counterfeit 5s on the New York Security Bank, observe that in the genuine the downward curve of the top of the figure 5 (on the left of the note) just touches the shoulder of the 5, while in the counterfeit there is a space between. In the counterfeit the word FIVE in the top of the figure is smaller than in the genuine, and the shading around is scatchy, coarser and lighter.



To detect the new counterfeit 2s on the Bank of Westfield, New York, observe that in the genuine the two hind feet of the nearest horse are directly over the letters I and E in WESTFIELD. In the counterfeit they are over the space between the letters. By looking closely at these cuts other differences may be observed.
