TOKYO, OCT. 2 -- (UP) -- JAPAN'S NO. I COMMUNIST KYUICHI TOKUDA SAID SUNDAY RUSSIA'S POSSESSION OF THE ATOMIC SOME BREAKS CAPITALISTIC MONOPOLY OF THE SOME AND WILL "GUARANTEE" WORLD PEACE.

TOKUDA SPOKE AT A RALLY SPONSORED BY THE LIAISON COUNCIL OF ALL TRADE Unions of Japan to observe an international day "To demonstrate the determined will to defend world peace by the united forces of all working peoples, about 600,000,000 of 72 countries in the world."

PROF. INUO CYAMA, WHO WAS RELEASED LAST WEEK WITHOUT BAIL BY OCCUPATION AUTHORITIES AFTER HAVING BEEN ARRESTED ON A CHARGE OF RMXX FALSELY CRITICIZING THE OCCUPATION, ALSO DESCRIBED THE SOVIET UNION'S POSSESSION OF THE ATOM SOMB AS A "HAPPY THING FOR WORLD PEACE."

"THE XMEXIXMEXIC THREAT OF WAR HAS PREVENTED THE WORLD FROM
BEING ONE," SAID THE PROFESSOR WHO TAUGHT DURING THE WAR AT NORTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY IN CHICAGO. "THAT THREAT WAS THE POSSESSION OF THE
ATOMIC BOMB BY ONE COUNTRY."

OYAMA SAID HE BELIEVED OUTLAWING OF THE ATOMIC BOND IN WAR AND INTERNATIONAL CONTROL OF ATOMIC ENERGY IS NOW "HOPELESS" BUT HE THOUGHT POSSESSION OF THE BOND BY THE "TWO SIDES" OF THE WORLD WOULD LEAD TO WORLD PEACE.

TOKUDA WAS INTRODUCED TO THE ROSTRUM AFTER GORO HAM!, LEFTIST

OPPOSED TO WAR AND ASSERTED THAT VIOLATION OF PEOPLE'S BASIC RIGHTS?

A COMMUNIST CHORUS STARTED TO SING AS TOKUDA MOUNTED THE ROSTRUM AND WAS ORDERED TO STOP.

"RUSSIA HAS THE ATOMIC BOMB," TOKUDA SAID THE OUTSET OF HIS SPEECH AS MOST OF THE THREE THOUSAND PEOPLE PRESENT CHEERED.

THE SOVIET UNION IS A FORTRESS OF THE LABORING MASSES," TOKUDA CONTINUED. Zhussia's breaking of the atom bomb monopoly of a certain capitalistic nation is the strongest gurantee of world peace."

THE COMMUNIST PARTY'S SECRETARY GENERAL CHARGED THAT CAPITALISTIC COUNTRIES CANNOT CONTRIBUTE TO PEACE BUT THE SOVIET UNION HAS NO SUCH OBSTACLES. HE SAID RUSSIA HAS NO UNEMPLOYMENT PROBLEM AND NO OTHER FACTORS TO BRING ABOUT WAR.

TORUDA SAID RUSSIA'S POSSESSION OF THE ATOM SOME WILL DEAL THE YOSHIDA CABINET AND "CAPITALISTS" BEHIND THE GOVERNMENT A "BIG

CYAMA SAID, "WE MUST FIGHT FOR PEACE AND THAT MEANS WE HAVE TO FIGHT MANERAUX FASCISTS AND IMPERIALISTS. WE MUST FIGHT THE YOSHIDA GOVERNMENT."

HE CHARGED THAT THE "REACTIONARY" YOSHIDA GOVERNMENT WAS TRYING TO OUST DEMOCRATIC TEACHERS FROM THE UNIVERSITIES AND XHAMMERENAMENEMENT WAS ARREST TRAMPLING" ON JAPANESE CULTURE.

HE SAID THE JAPANESE PROPLE MUST REASSERT THEIR OPPOSITION TO WAR, POINTING OUT THAT LEADERS OF THIS MOVEMENT BACK IN 1918 HAD TO MAKE SACRIFICES. HE STRESSED THAT THE JAPANESE NOW HAD A WEAPON IN THE REMEX POTEDAM DECLARATION AND THE NEW CONSTITUTION.
