The committee appointed to select uniform for First Defenders Association, would most respectfully report that in compliance with that duty they have concluded their labors and report the uniform to consist of the following: -

Coat and pants, to be of dark blue cloth. Vest, white duck or other material (same as now worn by G.A.R.) with the exception of the buttons, which shall be the Pennsylvania State Button.

Cap, similar to the regulation fatigue cap of the U.S. Navy, with the New York peak, and the words "First Defenders" "April 18th 1861 and white keystone, all worked in gilt embroidary; letters to be 1/2 inch in length; gilt cord running over the top from side button to button. Gloves, white.
