

Project I: A Living Handbook for Art **History Articles**

We are developing suggestions for the structure of the articles, for the correct use of specialized terminology, and for ensuring scholarly quality. The project is open, so that changes and further developments are possible at any time. The Living Handbook is intended to contribute to good art history articles the articles should meet the requirements of both the discipline and Wikipedia.

Project II: Wikipedia in university teaching

In the past, art history lecturers hardly thought about the potential of the free online encyclopedia for use in teaching.
